

## Education is the key to life

Our projects provide children and youth who otherwise do not go to school with access to education and vocational training.

Still, only one in five children in South Asia learns to read and do arithmetic properly. Together with our local partners, we have developed concepts to make a sustainable and structural change. We support government schools to succeed and to improve their teaching quality.

### For more than 18 years: Sustainable engagement for underprivileged

In focus: refugees, street children, minorities

Our goal: All children obtain their rights, above all, access to good education.

#### We therefore focus especially on

- Help for exploited minorities Care for street children in remote areas
- Child laborers without access to school and youth without formal training
- in the slums
- Education for boys and girls growing up in refugee camps



Our projects help the **poorest of the poor** – independently of their origin, gender, religion, culture or nationality. The majority of students in our courses are girls and young women.

#### No charity but impetus for change

We regard our support as help for self-help.

Our projects complement government education programs – they do not replace them. We only support projects where the village elders and those affected contribute, because only then can these projects have a lasting effect.

We work with local partners to make sure that the state and civil society take responsibility so that we can make ourselves and our projects redundant.

We are helping more than 1,600 government schools to improve their quality.


We support vocational training of tens of thousands young people.

We pay about 2,500 salaries for teachers and social workers.


